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13. Results of Practical/ Scientific value:

- Different food processing wastes were evaluated for their suitability for developing packaging film.
- Potato peel and sweet lime pomace were selected and successfully utilized for developing biopolymer film.
- Effect of ultrasound and high pressure treatment on sweet lime peel and mustard meal based biopolymer film is also studied.
- The essential oil from sweet lime (*Citrus limetta*) peel was extracted using vacuumassisted solvent free microwave extraction.
- Effect of ultrasound pre-treatment fallowed by microwave extraction on yield of essential oil was studied and it showed the significant effect on yield of essential oil.
- The extracted oil was incorporated in sweet lime pomace based film. The film showed the effective antimicrobial properties.
- The active film was applied on fish fillet and their quality changes were studied. The film was comparable with polyethylene in many aspects with added antimicrobial activity.
- The study will provide information to industry, academia and different departments of governments for effective utilization of food industry wastes.
